**Uday Devgan, MD** is in private practice, specializing in cataract and refractive surgery, at <a href="Devgan Eye Surgery">Devgan Eye Surgery</a> in Los Angeles and a full partner at Specialty Surgical Center in Beverly Hills, California. Dr Devgan is also passionate about teaching ocular surgery, particularly cataract surgery, to the next generation of ophthalmologists. He has previously served as full clinical Professor of Ophthalmology at the Jules Stein Eye Institute at the UCLA School of Medicine as well as <a href="Chief of Ophthalmology at Olive View-UCLA Medical Center">Chief of Ophthalmology at Olive View-UCLA Medical Center</a> and has been actively involved in resident surgical teaching for over two decades. Dr. Devgan is humbled to have won

the most Surgical Professor Teaching Awards (5x) in the history of UCLA's Ophthalmology Department. He continues to mentor former residents after the culmination of their training and is proud to say that he has directly mentored nearly 200 residents over the course of thousands of ocular surgeries.

He has been named one of the top key opinion leaders in ophthalmology and he has taught ocular surgery in more than 60 countries to tens of thousands of fellow ophthalmologists. Dr Devgan runs <a href="CataractCoach.com">CataractCoach.com</a> which has more than 2,000 teaching videos/articles and boasts 60,000 subscribers with more than 30 million views. He also developed an entire <a href="Curriculum series">Curriculum series</a>, a free <a href="Cataract surgery book">Cataract surgery book</a> and now the top <a href="Dodcast">podcast</a> in ophthalmology. Dr Devgan is a leader in ophthalmic consulting and lecturing services for organizations and industry and has performed live surgery events at many major ophthalmic meetings. In addition, his charity surgical mission trips have taken him around the globe. Most recently he has started a revolutionary AI bio-mathematical company (<a href="IOLcalc.com">IOLcalc.com</a>) helped develop an innovative truly accommodating lens implant (<a href="LensGen.com">LensGen.com</a>), and is involved with the future of fully robotic cataract surgery (<a href="Horizon Surgical">Horizon Surgical</a>).

Most importantly, Uday has been blessed with two amazing kids who love him and help to keep his ego in check when they remind him that he is still a geek.



Lama Al-Aswad, MD, MPH was most recently Professor of Ophthalmology and Professor of Population Health, Vice Chair for Innovations, and Director of Teleophthalmology, AI and Innovations at NYU Langone Health. Dr. Al-Aswad earned her medical degree from Damascus University (Syria), completed her residency at SUNY Downstate and glaucoma fellowship at the University of Tennessee, and earned an MPH in Health Care Policy and Management at Columbia University Mailman School of Public Health. During her time on faculty at Columbia University and NYU Langone, Dr. Al-Aswad acquired over 20 years' experience in complex glaucoma and complex cataract surgery cases. As a leader in the field of telemedicine, artificial intelligence, and innovations, a few of her

achievements at Columbia University include launching the first teleophthalmology mobile unit to screen for the four leading causes of blindness in synchronous fashion and at NYU Langone she launched the ophthalmology data center, building and validating the NYU Langone eye test and teleophthalmology with remote monitoring during COVID.

Dr. Al-Aswad has created educational curricula for medical students, residents, and fellows, and the artificial intelligence and teleophthalmology curriculums at NYU Langone. In 2004, she started the glaucoma fellowship program at Columbia University and was its director from 2013-2019. In 2020, she started and directed the ophthalmology innovation fellowship at NYU Langone Department of Ophthalmology. In addition to treating both glaucoma and cataract patients in the glaucoma clinical service at Scheie, Dr. Al-Aswad will be the Vice Chair for Quality and will build and develop and serve as Director of teleophthalmology, Al and Innovations programs.



Wiley A. Chambers, MD is an ophthalmic pharmaceutical consultant with Ocular Advisors LLC. Previously he held the position as Director, Division of Ophthalmology in the Office of New Drugs, Center for Drug Evaluation and Research at the Food and Drug Administration. After receiving an undergraduate degree from Colgate University, Dr. Chambers completed medical school and residency in Ophthalmology at The George Washington University School of Medicine and Health Sciences in Washington, DC. He is currently a Clinical Professor of Ophthalmology and Adjunct Assistant Professor of Computer Medicine at The George Washington University. He had joined the FDA in 1987, as a primary reviewer for ophthalmic drug products and in 1990 became a Supervisory Medical Officer for Ophthalmologic

Drug Products. In this capacity, Dr. Chambers had supervisory responsibility for the clinical review of ophthalmologic drug products and ophthalmic therapeutic biologic products submitted to the Center for Drug Evaluation and Research.

He is the recipient of numerous Public Health Service, FDA and Center for Drug Evaluation and Research awards for his work with the FDA and has served as the American Academy of Ophthalmology's Delegate to past United States Pharmacopeia Conventions.




Gary S. Hirshfield, MD is an Associate Professor at Hofstra Medical School. Dr. Hirshfield has practiced comprehensive ophthalmology since 1990 and his practice, located in Fresh Meadows, is the Queens division of Northwell Health Ophthalmology. He completed his residency training at Manhattan, Eye, Ear, and Throat Hospital and spent two years as a resident instructor teaching a new generation of ophthalmologists.

Dr. Hirshfield previously held the position of President of the NYS Ophthalmological Society and served on its Board of Directors. His professional memberships include but are not limited to American Society of Cataract and Refractive Surgeons, Medical Society of the State of New York, he is a Fellow of the American

Academy of Ophthalmology and American College of Surgeons.

He currently serves as a member of the AAO Secretariat for State Affairs which is responsible for providing guidance and support to state ophthalmology societies in legislative and regulatory matters and organizational development.
